Every Child Ready to Read Skill

Writing

Babies - Give your babies opportunities throughout the day to pull, push and grasp.

Toddlers - Simple activities like grasping your finger, holding a rattle, and playing with their food help support the skills and development they will need when they start learning how to write. Point out written letters and words on signs during outings to help your child understand that letters and print have meaning.

Preschoolers - Write your child's name on any art or coloring project they do and talk about each letter as you write it (and once they have started writing letters, encourage them to write their names themselves)
