


► Trace the letter I



As children see print used in their daily lives, they begin to recognize that *those printed letters stand for spoken words*. Children who scribble, draw, and do crafts are practicing coordination and exercising their hand and finger muscles. This develops the fine motor control needed in order to hold a pencil and write letters and words.

Try these:

Use finger paints, playdough, magnetic letters, label drawings, make lists, “sign” artwork.
