

EXPUNGE OR SEAL CRIMINAL RECORD STEP 2: PETITION

OVERVIEW

This guide provides information to assist those who wish to petition the court to expunge or seal a criminal history record *after* receiving the Certificate of Eligibility from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. Note: the original Certificate of Eligibility from the FDLE is required to file the Petition to Expunge or Seal.
